IN THE PANDEMIC OF COVID-19

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SARS was a tragic experience for the majority of us. Since 2003, there have been 9 councils serving the Hong Kong College of Orthopaedic Surgeons. Despite the memory of SARS remaining fresh in the memories of many council members serving over the past 17 years, no one had really expected a similarly deadly virus to attack Hong Kong again.

Unfortunately, the new coronavirus infection started in our neighbourhood in December 2019. The first confirmed case of COVID-19 was diagnosed in Hong Kong on January 23rd 2020.

But unlike during the times of SARS, this time, the medical professions in Hong Kong are much better prepared. We have a greater understanding on how to protect ourselves and our beloved ones. We vigilantly observe hand hygiene, personal protection and social distancing in Hong Kong. However, the life of the general public and health care workers have changed significantly since then.



During the Chinese New Year holiday in late January 2020, in view of the escalating epidemic in Mainland China and the first confirmed diagnosis of COVID-19 in Hong Kong, the council of the Hong Kong College of Orthopaedic Surgeons had decided to cancel and/or postpone all face-to-face academic meetings organised by the HKCOS, taking effect from February 1st 2020 onwards. - 8. HKCOS and RCSEd Joint Specialty Fellowship Examination in May 2020 (POSTPONED)

ONLINE MEETING

Threat and opportunity are two sides of the same coin.

Although the Council had to cancel all face-to-face academic activities from February 1st 2020 onwards, we quickly found a new way of conducting academic activities - **online meetings**.

The College hosted our first online inter-hospital meeting and our first online clinical tutorial on February 8th 2020 (i.e. one week after the cancellation of face-to-face academic meetings).




There was a record-breaking attendance of 252 participants for the online CPC meeting, and 60 participants for the online clinical tutorial on paediatric orthopaedics held on that day.

From February 8th to March 31st 2020, the College organised a total of eight online inter-hospital meetings.



The average attendance of the inter-hospital meetings was 247 (range: 140 to 322).

A total of eleven online clinical tutorials were held. The average attendance was 26 trainees per tutorial (range: 9 to 61). These figures compared favourably to our historical data (average attendance of inter-hospital meetings: 49 members per meeting; average attendance of clinical tutorials: 9 trainees per tutorial).



The council is very happy to see that these online activities are well received by our members in this difficult period of the COVID-19 pandemic.

CONCLUSION

The council is determined to foster the continued medical education of orthopaedic surgeons and to maintain a high-quality of orthopaedic training to our trainees. The College will be sure to fulfil these missions to the best of our abilities.
